

AAW 'Chain Letter' Hits the Internet

I tracked down the source of the blurb to a news release organization that writers have to pay to have their news picked up and published by media types.

And I'm not much of a detective. But, **I** found it. I mean, how tissue-thin is that?

Is this what the extreme left is resorting to these days to push their pieces of legislation through the Congress? Chain letters?

I am sure the AAW and many other sources probably support the measures of the EARA as the act is called. The measure is a rip-off of the H-2B controversy as it stands right now. There is nothing original about EARA. Only, its presumptions are completely invalid. Two glaring ones are these:

#1-Basically EARA calls for making illegal workers legal by allowing them to work in this country if they have experience in the agricultural field
